Joseph Schumpeter was an Austrian-American Economist,
who is best known for his work on innovation and entrepreneurship
as well as for popularizing the term "creative destruction."

The year 2013 marks the 100th anniversary of Joseph Schumpeter's
first visit to the U.S. as an exchange professor at Columbia University at age 30.

Harvard University appointed Schumpeter as professor in 1932 where he remained until
his retirement in 1948. Prior to his permanent appointment, Schumpeter was a visiting
Professor at Harvard University in 1927 and 1928.

Brigitte is an Associate Professor of Suffolk University and a prolific author whose works range
from practice management advice for CPAs to articles on future uses of artificial intelligence.
She writes a regular column about Boston life for an Austrian magazine for Financial Executives.
